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

In 2017, there were an estimated 219 million cases of malaria in the world, and almost half a million malaria deaths. Africa was home to 92% of these malaria cases and 93% of the malaria deaths. With this Gift of Change we can help change these statistics. Working at all levels of government and healthcare, and with traditional community leadership, CPAR is engaging communities with awareness and prevention. Help non-government organizations, communities, and governments come together to prevent new infections, save lives and end malaria.

This Gift of Change will help improve the availability of quality sexual and reproductive health services for women and adolescent girls. The SRHR services that will be addressed include youth-targeted education and counselling about sexual development, reproduction and human sexuality; family planning (FP - unwanted pregnancy prevention, birth spacing) counseling and services; treatment and prevention of reproductive tract and sexually transmitted diseases and infections including HIV; and prevention and treatment of unsafe deliveries and birth complications including obstetric fistula (OF).

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Poor sanitation is a significant cause of death, disease and disability in the world, especially in developing countries. According to the World Health Organization, unsafe water, and poor sanitation and hygiene kill about 1.7 million people every year. CPAR is combatting this by empowering communities through the use of Community Led Total Sanitation, an approach that mobilizes communities to appraise their poor sanitation practices, such as open defecation, and to take action. Our programs accelerate latrine coverage, improve sanitation practices and water access, and encourage schools and communities to become open-defecation free. Help villages and communities create clean environments and prevent the spread of sanitation related diseases!

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Open defecation is when people empty their bowels out in the open instead of in a structure like a toilet. Open defecation causes contamination of water systems, which are drinking water sources for the local population. And flies can also transmit the contaminants onto people's food and drink. It is believed that poor sanitation is the main cause of over 400,000 deaths each and every year.

Rachael Banda lives in Chilowamatambe village in Kasungu District, Malawi. She is a 48 year old farmer with primary school education. It was a common practice for people in her village to practice open defecation because most households had no toilets including her household. Below is what she said;

"Before CPAR came to my village, many of us we had no toilets including myself. I was using my neighbour's toilet and my children were going into the bush. Many people were suffering from diarrhea and other stomach illnesses throughout the year. CPAR taught us the importance of proper hygiene and demonstrated how to properly wash our hands and, the benefit of having toilets. CPAR trained us on how to build toilets. Since we built our toilet, diarrhea is longer a problem in our family and our village has had fewer problems with diarrhea and less people practicing open defecation."

Low income people living in Sub-Saharan Africa have limited access to health information and educational outreach is hampered by low levels of literacy.

That's where community radio steps in. Radio remains one of the most popular tools in homes across Sub-Saharan Africa for the rich or poor, literate or illiterate, adult or young, both in cities and rural areas. Radio broadcasting contributes to improved health outcomes by providing information about health rights, risks, disease prevention and better health. It is estimated that nearly half of all deaths and a third of disabilities in low- and middle-income countries result from conditions that could be addressed by emergency care.

Poorly equipped hospitals pose high risks to patients' lives at a time when they are most in need. The risks are even greater in rural hospitals, which have a higher share of emergency injury cases. A lack of proper medical equipment can make the difference between life or death, or a lifetime of disability. In the rural health centres where we work, none of the emergency rooms have even the most basic of equipment such as ECG monitors, defibrillators, incubators, back boards, oral airways, nasopharyngeal airways, suction machines, or even pediatric blood pressure cuffs. This Gift of Change contributes to supplying hospitals with essential equipment so that health workers can more effectively address the immediate needs of families living in remote towns and villages.


